Following the completion of the recent inspection, the Ministry noted the many strengths of the organization and confirmed that Middlesex Community Living meets or exceeds all Quality Assurance Measures and policy directives applicable to MCCSS.



Have you seen this decal around town? The Strathroy-Caradoc Welcome Committee developed and launched the Welcoming Community Decal of Distinction program. The decal quickly and easily identifies local businesses and community groups who demonstrate the following 5 core characteristics: Accessible, Compassionate, Friendly, Helpful, and Safe. Thanks to the hard work of the dedicated committee, a Welcoming Community toolkit was developed and made available to organizations like CL Huntsville, CL Mississauga, and even Chilliwack, British Columbia to help them build their Welcoming Community.



Middlesex Community Living recognizes the stress and uncertainty that parents of adult children face in trying to find government-funded supportive housing. To meet the needs of those in our community who continue to sit on long waitlists for accommodation services, the Board of Directors approved the purchase of a new home. The new residence is scheduled for renovations this fall and early winter with hopes to bring people into service early in 2021.
